The Journeys of Harry Crosby

Lifelong La Jolla resident Harry Crosby was hired by the Commission of the Californias in 1967 to identify the route taken by Don Gaspar de Portolá and Friar Junípero Serra during their historic expedition in 1769. Crosby's photographs and writings during the 600-mile trek by mule were published in *The Call to California* in 1969. Film producers David Richardson and Isaac Arstenstein, of Cinewest Productions, will discuss their full-length documentary entitled *The Journeys of Harry Crosby* and present a "work-in-progress" sneak peek of their film.

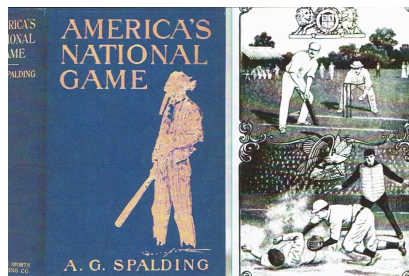
La Playa Trail Association Presents the Amazing Mr. Spalding

Albert Goodwill Spalding was an American pitcher, manager and executive in the early years of professional baseball and the co-founder of A.G. Spalding Sporting Good Company.

In 1900 he moved to San Diego and became a prominent supporter of the Theosophical

Society community Lomaland, which was being developed on Point Loma by Katherine Tingley.

In 1907-09 he was the driving force behind the development of a paved road known as Point Loma Boulevard that connected downtown San Diego to Point Loma and Ocean Beach. It later provided the basis for CA Route 209. His many adventures in San Diego will be discussed by Eric DuVall, President of the Ocean Beach Historical Society on November 20 at Point Loma Assembly from 5:30-7 p.m. \$10 donation suggested. Point Loma Assembly's Legacy Fund was established in 2016 to supplement rental income to enhance and maintain the Assembly's historic property. To date the Legacy Fund has assisted with the installation of air conditioning/Wi-Fi and new flooring in the building, and the reconstruction of the sidewalk to meet safety concerns.
