The Point Loma Assembly’s Legacy Fund received \$93,335 in contributions from the first gift received in 2016 through December 2022. The Legacy Fund supplements income received from memberships, building rentals, and grants to ensure appropriate stewardship of the Assembly’s historic property at 3035 Talbot Street. Funds contributed to the Legacy Fund are restricted to being used for Building and Property improvements and prevention and repair of damage to the premises.

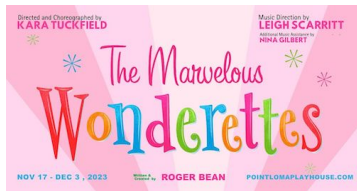
